



2017 Woodside Students Summer

Concept:

The summer months provide some of the best opportunities to intentionally connect with students because they're out of school and have plenty of time to hang, be challenged, engage in community, and grow in their relationship with Jesus! We want to capitalize on this time by creating chances for students to connect with one another, with small group leaders, and with us. We also want to give them unique opportunities to grow in their faith by being disciplined and to reach the world around them by serving others. Our focus is to create spaces where students can grow closer together and deeper in their relationship with God while being motivated and challenged to invite new students to a Woodside Student environment.

FOCUS: Ownership & Alignment:

Over the past two years we have looked to align our schedule across the board. Throughout the time we saw some great successes and learned a lot along the way as we looked to make the most of the opportunities presented to minister and disciple students through the summer months. A lot of what we've learned has been perpetuated by our ever-growing number of campuses along with the shifts in student ministry staff dynamics & roles across the board. This has led us to approach this summer with an "Ownership & Alignment" mindset.

Ownership

The truth is that we care more about something and take more care of something when we take & have ownership of it. With that in mind, we want to give campuses more ownership in the decisions made regarding their summer student ministry schedule. I'll share more in a moment on how we do so without forsaking alignment later on, however, let's start by talk more about the framework of ownership.

In the following pages you will see a whole bunch of key dates, programs, events, and ideas to help make your summer the best that it can be for the middle & high school students and their families at your campus & in your community. Underneath each one of those you will see a ● **RED LIGHT**, ● **YELLOW LIGHT**, or ● **GREEN LIGHT** label. These are meant to indicate what the priority & expectation is for that particular event, activity, program. Here's what they mean:

● **RED LIGHT** – this is mandatory, must be done, "the buck stops here..." In the proposed summer schedule, you will find six **RED LIGHT** headings. Out of those, four of them are mission trip related, one is All-Campus SGL Training, and the other is "Move Up Sunday". Within each

one of these are varying expectations. The **RED LIGHTS** that demand your physical presence and active involvement both preceding and during is Hope Week Parent Meeting (June 11th), Hope Week (July 15th-20th) and our All-Campus SGL Training (August 20th)

● **YELLOW LIGHT** – just as when you approach a yellow light and need to make the decision of “Should I stop?” or “Should I go?” so it is with the Woodside Student programs, events, & activities marked as **YELLOW LIGHT**. Things marked as **YELLOW LIGHT** are of great value as they include key milestone events, relational connections, spiritual development, and opportunities to partner with parents. They have been marked as **YELLOW LIGHT** to provide you greater freedom & flexibility as you plan your campus specific Woodside Student’s summer calendar. Within certain **YELLOW LIGHT** heading you will find an “Opt-In” or “Opt-Own”. These headings provide you with another set of options when it comes to planning. They’re defined at greater length below.

● **GREEN LIGHT** – All systems go! Things marked as **GREEN LIGHT** are suggestions for you to take or leave or even add onto. These are programs, events, or activities that align with Woodside’s doctrine along with the Woodside Student’s DNA & ministry philosophy. These include events like a worship night, programs like a weekly Bible Study, and activities such as Tasty Thursday. We’ve provided a few ideas of **GREEN LIGHT** options but feel free to dream big & use your imagination as you contextualize an event, program, or activity for your campus!

Opt-In: If you see this heading underneath a **YELLOW LIGHT** it means that you have the option to opt-in and make this event a multi-site event. You’ll see the expectations for staff along with budget suggestion for said event. **The opt-in date for the 2017 summer calendar is March 2nd.**

Opt-Own: If you choose not to opt-in to a **YELLOW LIGHT** then you’re choosing to opt-own. This means that you’re choosing to own this event as a campus. The expectations as listed in the opt-in category may be the same along with any additional expectations you may need to take on as you lead this event. A win for if you decide to opt-own is the freedom you get in tailoring a high capacity event or key milestone for your campus specific context. If you were to opt-own for a milestone event such as Jumpstart or FreshStart then we will equip you with the teaching materials being utilized for those events. **The opt-own date for the 2017 summer calendar is March 2nd.**

Alignment

We know & believe that we are able to give greater ownership to a student ministry team across the campuses because of the high capacity & character that makes up this team. It is clear that we are all bought-in to the philosophy, approach, and DNA of Woodside Students for many reasons from our collaboration on it, to the way we’ve seen families engaged, to being a part of the transformative work that God is doing in and through so many students.

Being aligned means that whether it is a **RED LIGHT**, **YELLOW LIGHT**, or **GREEN LIGHT** it is done with the utmost excellence and intentionality. We don’t work against or compete against one another thus why we all champion things like our Woodside Student Missions not just because it’s a **RED LIGHT** but because we believe in the importance of high school students being a part of a short-term mission trip, the calling God has put on their heart to serve, and the opportunity we have to disciple them as they grow in their giftedness.

One of our greatest strengths throughout the years has been alignment and we believe the reason why it has been such a strength is because of another one of our values, evaluation & collaboration. Throughout and after Summer 2017 we will collectively evaluate every event, activity, program, & trip. As we do so, we will follow God's leading and allow that to shape the decisions we make for the following year. Perhaps that means we look at adding another mission trip to a Native American reservation because God has pressed it upon your heart. Perhaps that means we look at all doing a giant kickball tournament because White Lake did it, it was awesome, and it was a huge outreach & on-ramp for new students. Who knows what may come next because of this summer?

Meet with your Campus Pastor to discuss what the summer calendar for Woodside Students at your campus will look like. Make the decisions with them in regards to what you might opt-in to or what you might decide to opt-own as you look to make this the best summer ever for your Oasis & Wake students! **After doing so, the next step is to send your 2017 summer calendar to Joe Crabb by Thursday, March 2nd.** From there, Joe will set up a meeting with you, the student ministry director or pastor, to discuss how he can best support you and your campus for the upcoming summer.

As you continue to read through this document you will see a list of events, programs, and activities for this upcoming summer. Each one of them are labeled, **RED**, **YELLOW**, or **GREEN** along with whether it is an individual campus, all-campus, or potential multi-site event. Underneath those headings you will find which ministry it focuses on, the purpose of it, expectations, an idea of what that event or program "looks like", and budget suggestions or needs. Beyond that you will find a Frequently Asked Questions section and a three-month summer calendar with marked out **RED LIGHT** dates and proposed **YELLOW LIGHT** dates. We've also sent you a budget spreadsheet to help you financially plan for the upcoming summer.

Before you move on, I want to encourage you to spend a few moments (or perhaps even hours) in prayer, seeking God's direction for this next season of ministry.

So are you ready to start dreaming & planning for a life-changing, memorable summer as you partner with parents, mobilize small group leaders, and engage students to see them continue

to grow into the young men and women God has created them to be? Let's do this!

8th Grade Graduation Celebration:

● GREEN LIGHT – Individual campus

Ministry: Oasis

Purpose: **Engage the Family. Key Transitional Event.** The purpose is to set aside time to honor & celebrate those students who will be graduating out of Oasis this school year and to engage their families by having them be a part of the event/activity.

Expectations: To create a significant event/activity/moment that honors & celebrates your graduating class of 8th graders

What This Looks Like: This primarily depends on your context and the size of your class. Some have done a special 8th graders/parents night after the last week of Oasis (May 24th, this year), others have done a special Deep End service on a Sunday morning, while others have done a luncheon for the whole family on a Sunday afternoon.

Budget: Your discretion. Some campuses that have done a luncheon style event have charged family members or other non 8th grade students \$5 per person or \$20 per family. You may choose to budget more so that you can buy a gift for your 8th graders.

12th Grade Graduation Celebration:

● GREEN LIGHT – Individual campus

Ministry: Wake

Purpose: **Engage the Family. Key Transitional Event.** The purpose is to set aside time to honor & celebrate those students who will be graduating out of Wake this school year and to engage their families by having them be a part of the event/activity.

Expectations: To create a significant event/activity/moment that honors & celebrates your graduating class

What This Looks Like: This depends on your context and the size of your class. Some have done this “banquet style” on a Sunday night with a dinner and program whereas others have created a significant time to celebrate with students and their families at their home and some have only had one senior graduating that year and so they honored them on a Sunday morning during the worship service by having them share their testimony. The options are endless.

Budget: Your discretion. Those who have done “banquet style” events have budgeted money (generally \$8 per person) while charging \$5 per person or \$20 per family to help cover cost. The budgeted money goes toward covering the costs for seniors and providing them with a gift

Move-Up Sunday: June 11th

● RED LIGHT – Individual campus

Ministry: Woodside Students

Purpose: **Engage the Family. Key Transitional Event.** The purpose here is to have an intentional, key transition that sets the parent & student up for success as they prepare for their next phase within Woodside. Having an aligned date across the campuses and within ministries (Kids, Oasis, Wake) allows for greater alignment & success. Moving students up in June allows them to get adjusted & acclimated to being a part of a new ministry before heading into a new school. It spreads out the change and provides us many opportunities to equip them as a follower of Christ for their upcoming school year

Expectations: Transition students (5th>6th, 8th>9th, 12th>College) into their new age specific ministries

What This Looks Like: For most, simply crossing a hall into a new environment.

Budget: None needed unless you choose to do an event/activity attached to this day

Hope Week Parent Meeting: June 11th

● RED LIGHT – Individual Campus

Ministry: Woodside Students

Purpose: **Mobilize faith. Spiritual Development. Engage the Family. Relationship & Community Building.** To cast vision for Hope Week, to answer any questions asked by participants and their parents, and to spend time as a community praying for the upcoming week of service.

Expectations: Host one campus-specific parent & student meeting for participants of Hope Week (information & talking points provided) in which the details & expectations of the trip are clearly communicated to participants & parents. If a family is unable to attend the meeting then a separate independent meeting must occur between them and yourself.

What This Looks Like: A meeting at your campus with the students & parents of your campus who are attending Hope Week. It is recommended that this take place immediately following the last service at your campus on a Sunday and that lunch is provided. Information and notes will be provided for you to present at the meeting. You will need to print the necessary provided material

Budget: None. If you are providing lunch (recommended) then collect \$3 per person & deposit that money to designated account number as provided by Jackie Nanney.

Oasis Block Party: June 16th

● YELLOW LIGHT – Individual campus (opt-own) Multi-Site (opt-in)

Ministry: Oasis

Purpose: **Creating Spaces. Relationship & Community Building. Fun.** The purpose here is to have a great event/gathering to build community & have fun as you celebrate the end of the school year & beginning of summer!

Expectations if Opt-In: Fulfill specific role assigned to you by the Lead Student Pastor. Promote event. Recruit volunteers. Communicate to parents, students, & leaders pertinent information regarding the event (start times, cost, activities, transportation details...)

Expectations if Opt-Own: Host a great & fun event/gathering that builds community for middle school students by the end of June. This includes your new 6th graders (those 5th graders who you moved up the week prior). You may choose to combine this with Wake students.

What This Looks Like (Opt-In): This is a huge event that takes place in the parking lot & back forty of the Troy campus. We have food trucks, climbing walls, an octaball tournament, and a bunch more ridiculously fun summer activities!

What This Looks Like (Opt-Own): You have freedom here whether its hosting a late night laser tag party, having a huge kickball tourney, setting the world record for most ice cream consumed by middle schoolers, or a combination of all three. Whatever it is, make sure it is done with excellence and is an event worthy of celebrating the end of the school year & beginner of summer!

Budget if Opt-In: \$5 per student. Students will be pay \$5 for the event as well. The proposed budgeted number does not include transportation costs if you provide transportation

Budget if Opt-Own: Your discretion. The amount you would want to budget per student is dependent on the type of event that you would do.

Wake Block Party: June 17th

● **YELLOW LIGHT** – Individual campus (opt-own) Multi-Site (opt-in)

Ministry: Wake

Purpose: **Creating Spaces. Relationship & Community Building. Fun.** The purpose here is to have a great event/gathering to build community & have fun as you celebrate the end of the school year & beginning of summer!

Expectations if Opt-In: Fulfill specific role assigned to you by the Lead Student Pastor. Promote event. Recruit volunteers. Communicate to parents, students, & leaders pertinent information regarding the event (start times, cost, activities, transportation details...)

Expectations if Opt-Own: Host a great & fun event/gathering that builds community for high school students by the end of June. This includes your new 9th graders (those 8th graders who you moved up the week prior) You may choose to combine this with Oasis students.

What This Looks Like (Opt-In): This is a huge event that takes place in the parking lot & back forty of the Troy campus. We have food trucks, climbing walls, live music, three-on-three tourney, bonfires, and a bunch more ridiculously fun summer activities!

What This Looks Like (Opt-Own): You have freedom here whether its hosting a lake party, having a campus BBQ, throwing down on a kickball tourney, or a combination of all three.

Whatever it is, make sure it is done with excellence and is an event worthy of celebrating the end of the school year & beginner of summer!

Budget if Opt-In: \$5 per student. Students will be pay \$5 for the event as well. The proposed budgeted number does not include transportation costs if you provide transportation

Budget if Opt-Own: Your discretion. The amount you would want to budget per student is dependent on the type of event that you would do.

Jumpstart: June 21st – 22nd

● **YELLOW LIGHT** – Individual campus (opt-own) Multi-Site (opt-in)

Ministry: Oasis

Purpose: **Key-Transitional Event. Engage the Family. Spiritual Development.** The purpose here is to have a significant event around a significant transition in their life that will help them connect to Oasis right away as we encourage & challenge them to be a middle schooler who loves Jesus with everything.

Expectations if Opt-In: Promotion. Present at Jumpstart (hosted at a Woodside campus).

Recruit SGLs to be present to engage the students. Collect any paperwork & payments and send to Troy campus. Fulfill specific role & responsibility given to you by Lead Student Pastor.

Expectations if Opt-Own: Have significant, spiritual event for your new 6th grade students before the start of the school year. Hanging out on a Sunday afternoon, having pizza does not count as a spiritually significant event.

What This Looks Like (Opt-In): This overnight event is filled with multiple sessions, small group time, and a ton of fun as we do some great games like glow-in-the-dark capture the flag.

What This Looks Like (Opt-Own): Create a significant event for your brand new 6th graders! Make it excellent, engaging, fun, & intentional!

Budget: \$5 per student. Students pay \$20. Budgeted money allows us to keep the cost down for families while providing a top-notch level event for these new 6th graders.

Post-FLIP Activities: June 26th – 29th

● **GREEN LIGHT** – Individual campus

Ministry: Woodside Students

Purpose: **Relationship & Community Building. Encouragement.** The purpose here is to make the most the opportunity provided for community with students who are serving at your campus during FLIP.

What This Looks Like: Spending time with your Oasis & Wake students after FLIP is done that day. You could do something one day or every day and you can do anything from going out to eat to going bowling to sewing.

Budget: Your discretion if you choose to do anything.

Tasty Thursdays:

● GREEN LIGHT – Individual campus

Ministry: Woodside Students

Purpose: **Relationship & Community Building**. An intentional, individualized gathering with a focus on relational connection and friendship. This provides an excellent touch-point for you to offer your students and small group leaders while providing an opportunity to connect with your students about upcoming events!

What This Looks Like: These gatherings happen on Thursdays from 12:00pm-1:30pm and can take place anywhere/anyhow from grabbing food at your local McDonalds to hosting a pizza party at a student's pool! If you're going to do them then we recommend you do at least three throughout the summer. They cannot be done on the Thursday of Hope Week.

Expectations: The expectation is on you to make it happen if you choose to do so. That includes planning out where you're going to go to communicating it to students, parents, leaders... We will provide an editable graphic that you can edit to share your Tasty Thursday specific info.

Budget: Up to your discretion. Some have bought students slurpees while others have covered the cost of any leaders who show up for lunch.

Uganda Mission Trip: June 24th – July 6th, 2017

● RED LIGHT – All campuses

Ministry: Wake

Purpose: **Mobilize faith. Spiritual Development. Engage the Family**. To bring the life-changing message of Jesus Christ to the people of Uganda through work projects, VBS, evangelism, and other ministry opportunities. To continue to mobilize and encourage the faith of a student as they take part in a Woodside Students Level 5 mission trip

Expectations: To pray for and share the stories of the work that God is doing in and through our Wake students serving in Uganda.

What This Looks Like: Our team of students will be serving in the country of Uganda ministering in local schools, prisons, involved in teen outreach & ministering in the local community and church.

Budget: None. Students and leaders pay \$2800. Their payment covers the cost of airfare, lodging, food, supplies for ministry....Money has already been given towards the cost of the trip from LifeImpact to lower the cost to \$2800

Local Fireworks:

● GREEN LIGHT – Individual campus

Ministry: Woodside Students

Purpose: **Engage the Family. Relationship & Community Building.** The purpose here is to intentionally capitalize on a community-at-large event.

What This Looks Like: A lot of communities have large-scale firework events in which a great portion of our campuses, not just ministries, will be at. So grab a bunch of blankets, head there early, and let people know that you've got a spot saved for them. Communicate to families that you'll be there and perhaps consider buying a giant balloon to float up a 100 ft. in the air so they know where to find you.

Budget: Your discretion if you choose to do something. Not much is needed though, just a few bucks to maybe buy a student a lemonade and your wife a glow-in-the-dark rose.

Cran-Hill Mission Trip: July 2nd – 7th, 2017

● **RED LIGHT** – All campuses

Ministry: Wake

Purpose: **Mobilize faith. Spiritual Development. Engage the Family.** To share and show the love of Christ to the special needs community by serving as counselors and support staff at Cran-Hill Ranch's special needs camp. To continue to mobilize and encourage the faith of a student as they take part in a Woodside Students Level 3 mission trip

Expectations: Promotion. To encourage & challenge students who are ready for a level 3 mission trip experience to take sign-up. To assist in collecting paperwork & payment and sending it to Troy. To pray for and share the stories of the work that God is doing in and through our Wake students serving at Cran-Hill.

What This Looks Like: Our team of students will head to the west side of the state to work at a week-long camp for special needs adults. Students will spend their time doing everything from washing dishes to being a buddy to a camper.

Budget: None. Students and leaders pay \$300. Their payment covers the cost of lodging, food, supplies for ministry.....

Oasis Specific Summer Event: July

● **YELLOW LIGHT** – Individual campus

Ministry: Oasis

Purpose: **Creating Spaces. Relationship & Community Building. Fun.** The purpose here is to set aside time specifically for you and your leaders to connect with your Oasis students

Expectations: Create and host a fun event for Oasis students & leaders that fosters relationship & community building.

What This Looks Like: This is up to you and could be anything from a BBQ at your campus to a pool party at one of your families' houses. Have fun, make it excellent, & be intentional!

Budget: Up to your discretion as it depends on what you're doing.

Wake Specific Summer Event: July

● **YELLOW LIGHT** – Individual campus

Ministry: Wake

Purpose: **Creating Spaces. Relationship & Community Building. Fun.** The purpose here is to set aside time specifically for you and your leaders to connect with your Wake students

Expectations: Create and host a fun event for Wake students & leaders that fosters relationship & community building.

What This Looks Like: This is up to you & could be anything from a pool party at a families' houses to a late night movie night at your campus. Have fun, make it excellent, & be intentional!

Budget: Up to your discretion as it depends on what you're doing.

Hope Week: July 15th-20th, 2017

● **RED LIGHT** – All campuses

Ministry: Woodside Students

Purpose: **Mobilize faith. Spiritual Development. Engage the Family. Relationship & Community Building.** To partner alongside specific ministry partners in Detroit, Pontiac, and in the greater Metro-Detroit area to bring the life-changing message of Jesus Christ through work projects, evangelism, and other ministry opportunities. To partner alongside specific Woodside campuses in assisting the facilitation and execution of their FLIP camp

Expectations: Promote and get students signed up. Host one campus-specific parent & student meeting for participants of Hope Week (information & talking points provided) Collect paperwork & payments from students and send to Troy campus. Present for the entire trip (hosted at Rochester College). Oversee a work site and team (family) of students. Recruit leaders to stay for the entire week (**1 leader from your campus per 5 students attending**). Leaders must be members of Woodside and CPP certified. Recruit drivers for various days throughout the week (**1 driver from your campus per 10 students attending**). Recruited drivers must pass the Woodside Driver's Background check and be at least 25. To engage and encourage the mobilization (or continued mobilization) of a student's faith by having them take part in a Woodside Students Level 2 mission trip

What This Looks Like: This week is monumental as 275+ leaders & students from across Woodside come together to share & show the gospel in word & deed. We spend our days serving at various worksites across the Metro Detroit area and our evenings in sessions & group time. The week comes to a close with a huge celebration with parents & the team at the Troy campus on Thursday evening.

Budget: None. Students pay \$300 and leaders pay \$75. Their payment covers the cost of lodging, food, supplies for work/ministry sites....

Fresh Start: July 28th-29th, 2017

● **YELLOW LIGHT** – Individual campus (opt-own) Multi-Site (opt-in)

Ministry: Wake

Purpose: **Key-Transitional Event. Engage the Family. Spiritual Development.** The purpose is to have a significant event around a significant transition in their life that will help them connect to Wake right away as we encourage & challenge them to be a high-schooler who loves Jesus with everything.

Expectations if Opt-In: Promotion. Yourself or high capacity SGL present at Fresh Start (hosted at Camp Ohiyasha in Holly, MI). If high capacity SGL, we must know by May 1st. If they back out you're responsible for their replacement and/or coming in their stead. Assist in collecting any paperwork & payments and send to Troy campus. Fulfill specific role & responsibility given to you by Lead Student Pastor.

Expectations if Opt-Own: Have significant, spiritual event for your new 9th grade students before the start of the school year. Hanging out on a Sunday afternoon, having pizza does not count as a spiritually significant event.

What This Looks Like (Opt-In): This overnight event is filled with multiple sessions, small group time, and a ton of fun as we head to the great outdoors to enjoy the lakefront, zip-lining, & more!

What This Looks Like (Opt-Own): Create a significant event for your brand new 6th graders! Make it excellent, engaging, fun, & intentional!

Budget: \$20 per student. Students pay \$40. Budgeted money allows us to keep the cost down for families while providing a top-notch level event for these new 9th graders.

Oasis Specific Summer Event: August

● **YELLOW LIGHT** – Individual campus

Ministry: Oasis

Purpose: **Creating Spaces. Relationship & Community Building. Fun.** The purpose here is to set aside time specifically for you and your leaders to connect with your Oasis students

Expectations: Create and host a fun event for Oasis students & leaders that fosters relationship & community building.

What It Looks Like: This is up to you and could be anything from a BBQ at your campus to a pool party at one of your families' houses. Just don't repeat what you did in July...unless it was the sweetest thing ever and it will be a HUGE WIN for your campus

Budget: Up to your discretion as it depends on what you're doing.

Wake Specific Summer Event: August

● YELLOW LIGHT – Individual campus

Ministry: Wake

Budget: Up to your discretion as it depends on what you're doing.

All-Campus SGL Training: August 20th

● RED LIGHT – Individual Campus

Ministry: Woodside Students

Purpose: **Develop Leaders. Relationship & Community Building. Fun** To cast vision & train our Oasis & Wake small group leaders from across Woodside. Time is spent covering various essential aspects of being a small group leader, covering best practices, & spending time in prayer for the upcoming year.

Expectations: Promote and communicate the upcoming training event with their SGLs. Prepare for & lead the campus specific portion of the evening (30 minutes). Assist in the set-up & tear down of the training event. Own a role assigned to you by the Lead Student Pastor which includes but is not limited to creating & leading an fun, interactive element for SGLs, teach a portion of the training material...Every student ministry director/pastor is expected to host an additional SGL training at their campus before the school year launch to cover material more extensively and foster greater community amongst their SGLs. Information & talking points provided.

What This Looks Like: Oasis & Wake small group leaders from across Woodside come together for a night of prayer, vision, & training as we prepare for the upcoming school year of ministry.

Budget: \$7 per leader for the meal. They'll eat enough pizza & Jimmy Johns throughout the year. We want to provide a great & delicious meal that lets them know they're valued. If you desire to provide your leaders with a new SGL shirt or provide an SGL shirt to any of your new SGLs then it is recommended that you budget an additional \$10 per leader (cost of shirt)

Bible Study:

● GREEN LIGHT – Individual campus

Ministry: Woodside Students

Purpose: Spiritual Development. Relationship & Community Building

Expectations: Create and host an excellent Bible study for Oasis & Wake students that facilitates engaging discussion & deepens their relationship with Christ.

What It Looks Like: Format wise you can do whatever is best for your context whether that's doing separate Oasis & Wake studies, split guys & girls, a study on Romans, a book study...

Budget: Up to your discretion as it depends on what resources you may utilize. You may also choose to charge students for any necessary books or materials.

Worship Night:

● GREEN LIGHT – Individual campus

Ministry: Woodside Students

Purpose: Spiritual Development. Relationship & Community Building

Expectations: Create and host an excellent night of worship for Oasis & Wake students that provides an opportunity for them to collectively engage in authentic worship together.

What It Looks Like: Format wise you can do whatever is best for your context whether that's doing an acoustic night of worship around a bonfire or a night of prayer & worship at your campus.

Budget: Up to your discretion as it depends on what you're doing.

Family Fun Movie Night:

● GREEN LIGHT – Individual campus

Ministry: Woodside Students

Purpose: Engage the Family. Relationship & Community Building. Fun.

Expectations: Create and host a fun event for Oasis & Wake students and their families that fosters relationship & community building.

What It Looks Like: Format wise you can do whatever is best for your context. We'd recommend that you partner with Kid's ministry to make this a full, family fun event!

Budget: Up to your discretion as it depends on what you're doing. You could charge people a nominal amount depending on the event.

Service Project:

● GREEN LIGHT – Individual campus

Ministry: Woodside Students

Purpose: Mobilize faith. Spiritual Development. Relationship & Community Building.

Expectations: Create and host an excellent service project for your Oasis & Wake students to be able to mobilize their faith by putting it into action.

What It Looks Like: We'd recommend that you partner with an organization or ministry that Woodside already has a partnership with. It would be a greater win to do this after Hope Week and to go back to one of the sites your students served at during the week.

Budget: Up to your discretion as it depends on what you're doing.

Frequently Asked Questions:

Why do separate Oasis & Wake events?

Throughout the summer it is important to do separate Oasis & Wake events as it allows you to create a greater sense of community amongst the individual, stage-of-life, ministries. There's benefit in doing a combined event but a healthy ministry will have opportunities for separate Oasis & Wake events

Does budgeted money cover transportation costs?

No. If transportation is being provided for an event or activity outside of Jumpstart or Fresh Start then the costs must be covered out of a separate budget line.

What are transportation costs?

For a Woodside mini-bus the cost is whatever it takes to fill up the gas tank. If you need a school bus then Servicar charges \$66 per hour. Mini-busses seat 15 (including driver). School busses seat 52 (including their driver) If there's a situation in which every campus is going to an event, for example the Block Party, and every campus is providing transportation which leads some using mini-busses and others having to rent a school bus then the cost will be split up evenly amongst the campuses using a "per person charge" formula. The "per person charge" formula is based off of the total cost of the school bus and average cost of gas per mini-bus. For example, if a school bus is rented for 5 hours (total cost of \$330) and we use 8 mini-busses with an average gas cost of \$40 per vehicle (total cost of \$320) that bring us to a grand total of \$650. We then take the number of people in seats, so for this example let's say every seat is filled (171 people), and divide our total cost (\$650) by our total number of people (171) to get our "per person charge", which in this case would be just shy of \$4 a person.

Why budget money and charge people for an event?

We budget money to help offset the cost that we may have to charge a participant. This helps us to continually provide an excellent experience without pricing people out or overbearing our budgets.

What are some of the resources provided?

As mentioned above there are various events that we will provide talking points & information on. We will also provide materials that you'll be able to print out. There will be a graphics package provided for certain events such as Hope Week, Jumpstart, Fresh Start....graphics can be altered with your campus specific information if you are doing an Opt-Own Jumpstart or Fresh Start. Graphic templates will be provided for such GREEN LIGHT opportunities like Tasty Thursday. This will allow you to input the campus specific information as needed.
